To be a premier technical and management institution that provides transformational learning and multi-disciplinary research to develop socially conscious and competent professionals.

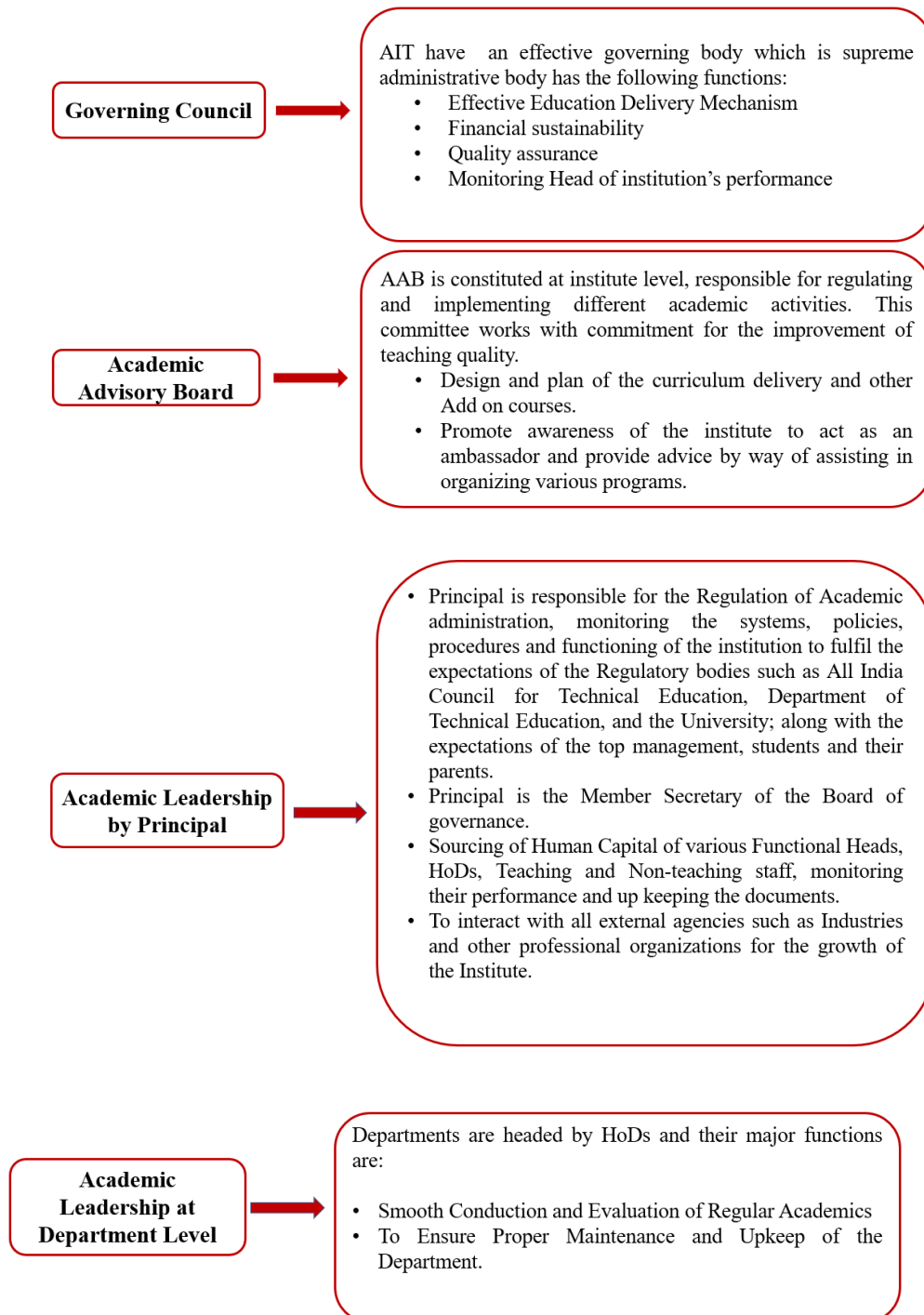

Decentralization and Participation:

AIT promotes a culture of participative management and has always been using decentralization of authority and participation of various stakeholders to strengthen the learning environment to promote inquisition, innovation, leadership, and team-spirit. All operations are managed by committees constituted for academic and non-academic activities which involve faculty, staff, and students. The delegation of administrative and financial powers of various functionaries are clearly defined.

- The Management and Principal are responsible for taking policy decisions for the Institution. The Principal has the authority of controlling and monitoring all academic and administrative activities of the Institute.
- Decentralisation is practiced in terms of financial autonomy to the Principal and to the Heads of the Department.
- HoDs are members of IQAC to facilitate the integration of various academic activities and guide to institutionalize the best practices of the institution.
- Various committee coordinators are appointed by the Principal in consultation with HoDs to carry out specific functions at college level. There are 17 committees functioning in the college and ensure that they address issues faced by the stake holders and aims for the improvements under the purview of the respective committees.
- HoDs are actively involved in decision making process, supports and guides in executing effective teaching learning process in consultation with senior faculty members. The Committee Coordinators are appointed by the HoDs to carry out specific functions at department level. The Class Coordinators and Mentors are appointed by HoDs to monitor the students' activities. As a part of Department Advisory Committee and Program Assessment Committee, the faculty members provide their inputs on academic related matters.
- Senior faculty members are members of various administrative bodies and hold positions like Placement Officer, Chief Hostel wardens, etc.
- AIT encourages women leadership in academic and administrative activities.
